

In 1849, Theodore Conkey set a wood post at this location and bearing trees were recorded.

In Book 2, page 388 of the County Surveyors Records undated and unspecific notes refer to an iron with the following ties.

In 1955 and 1960, in Book 2, page 388 of the County Surveyors Records, notes refer to an iron with the following reference ties.

P.P.	SW	66.35
10" Poplar	SE	75.9

On October 15, 2001 Westwood Professional Services, Inc. found a cast iron monument at the intersection of the centerlines of County Road 9 (running north and south) and County Road 5 (running east and west) and established reference ties.

10/10/02 No evidence remains of bearing trees or previous ties. Origin of CIM is not known, but can be accepted as marking the obliterated position of the corner.
