

Landscape Design Goals

To create a landscaped chain of roundabouts that reflect a contextual transition from a rural to urban landscape.

To use upright evergreen shrubs as the central vegetative form. The evergreens provide a screen for motorists as they are directed around the roundabout. The evergreens provide a seasonal display of color in the winter while serving as a simple green backdrop for ornamental grasses and randomly planted flowers through late summer and fall.

To use a high performance planting palette that provides visual interest while requiring minimal maintenance.

West Ramp Roundabout

The west ramp roundabout responds to the most urban development pattern with its use of a grid form.

Features:


- Square planting of upright evergreen shrubs.
- Evergreen square is set within a checkerboard matrix of alternating ornamental grasses and ornamental grasses with randomly planted native flowers.
- Portion of the splitter islands are planted with low growing daylilies.

East Ramp Roundabout

The east ramp roundabout serves as a gateway planting for the community.

Features:


- Circular pattern of upright evergreen shrubs.
- Circular form of the roundabout is enhanced with insets around the perimeter using ornamental grasses and randomly planted native flowers.
- Portion of splitter islands planted with low growing daylilies.




West Ramp Roundabout
